CAUSE OF INJURY: On August 1, 2003, Plaintiff visited Defendant's movie theater in Palm Harbor, entered the auditorium, and sat down in an aisle seat. Shortly thereafter, Plaintiff proceeded to the restroom and allegedly slipped and fell while descending a ramp within the auditorium. Plaintiff claimed that there was a greasy, slippery substance on the floor in the seating area that transferred to the soles of her shoes. Plaintiff further claimed that the lighting was inadequate and the subject ramp violated the Florida Building Code. Defendant denied the allegations and contended that the ramp did not constitute a dangerous condition. Defendant further contended that Plaintiff tripped over her own feet.

NATURE OF INJURY: Herniated disc at L4-L5 and L5-S1 which required double fusion; right knee (loose body) injury which required arthroscopic surgery (partial synovectomy); dislocated right shoulder. Plaintiff incurred \$ 63,000 in medical expenses and claimed \$ 370,000 in lost pension benefits, earnings, and earning capacity.
